FELT TECHNIQUES- Some ideas for your felting surface embellishment

The purple, white and black floral wrap to your right....This is a fine smooth felt with a shadowy fabric background and a floral surface pattern over the top. Lay down one solid layer of black needle felt batt as a base. Cover with netting. Wet down in your usual manner. Remove the net. Place layers of very fine white tissue silk georgette (3.5momme) over the wet batting pieces and edges overlapping each other and create small pleats in the fabric for shadowy interest. Cover again with net and flatten fabric with hands. Remove net. Lay a pattern of your choice on the wet

silk surface, Cover with net. Wet down again and then felt in your usual manner.




This is a piece of hard handmade felt that has then been needle felted using an embellishing machine with a fine layer of black wool tops on the surface. It can then, if desired, be wet felted a little more if it is going to be worn (for longevity and so it doesn't pill), or if for a wall hanging left as is. You could use a needle felt tool and the same effect would be achieved as the embellisher.
